



# Emergency Evacuation Information



Your safety is important. Please review the information below and follow all official instructions during an emergency, especially wildfires.

## Emergency Notification Systems

### Evacuation Routes

- In the event of a wildfire or other emergency, residents should plan to use their primary access route out of the neighborhood.
- If that route becomes unsafe or inaccessible, emergency personnel will communicate alternate evacuation routes and instructions.
- Follow all official directions immediately. Conditions can change quickly, and early compliance is critical to keeping routes open and safe.
- If people feel at all threatened, they should be prepared to take appropriate actions even without the direction of their governmental agencies.

#### EC ALERTS



Primary emergency notification system for Eagle County. Used for evacuation orders, fire updates, road closures, and critical alerts.

#### GENASYS PROTECT



Mobile app providing real-time, location-based alerts. Especially useful for visitors, renters, and those traveling within the county.

## What Do I do if I need to evacuate?

1. Close all windows and doors, including the garage door.
2. Park vehicles inside of the garage facing the outside (backed in), with the keys in the ignition.
3. Keep the garage door closed.
4. Thin or fine textured window coverings should be pulled back or removed from windows. Radiant heat through windows can ignite curtains.
5. Very heavy window coverings may be left in place and drawn closed as they may provide insulation.
6. Leave the front door unlocked for firefighter access.
7. Move patio furniture away from the structure.
8. Remove propane tanks from grills and leave them in garage or middle of driveway.
9. If you have a garden hose leave it attached to an outside faucet.
10. If you have a ladder, lean it against the house to provide access to the roof.
